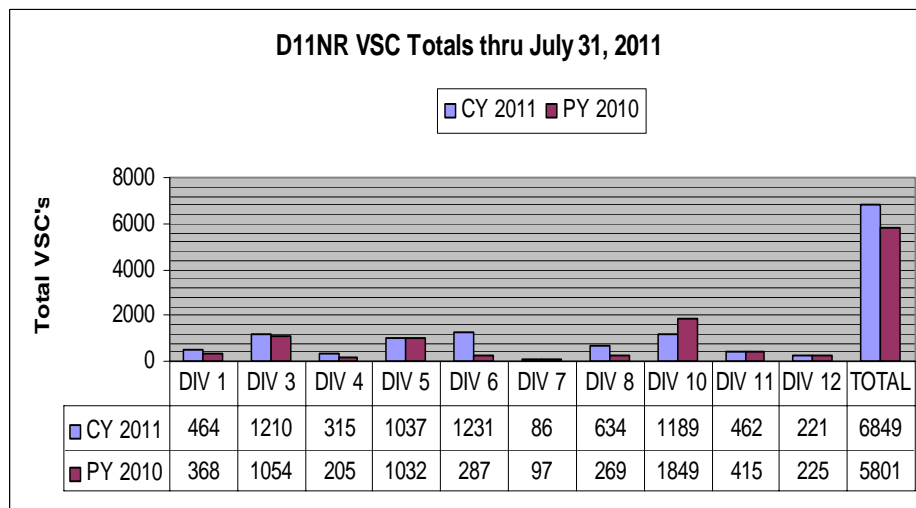

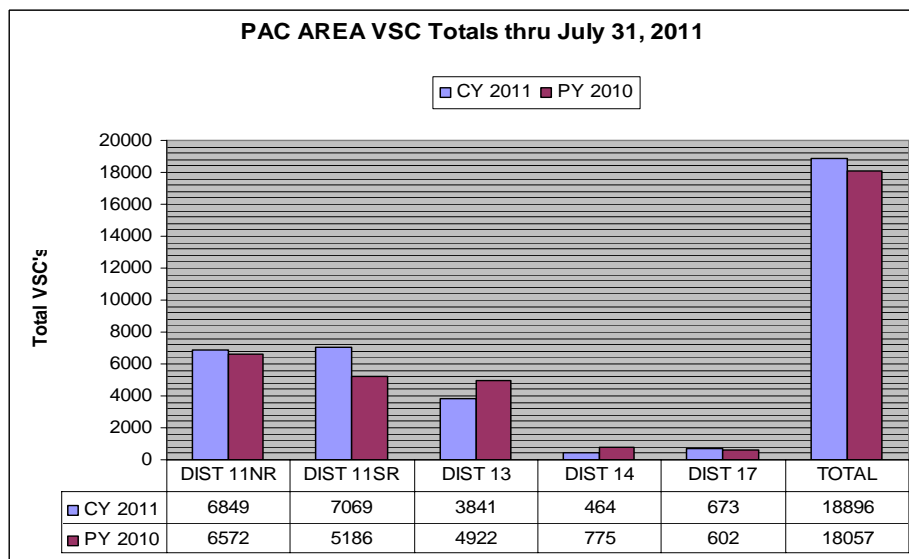

The goal for D11NR is **11,000 VSC's**. We are **62%** of our goal for the year and **118%** of 2010 production at this time! The data source is **AUXINFO***.

Additional stats from **AUXINFO*** indicates that **3,821** or **56%** of our VSC's are First Time VSC's. In addition **4,465** or **65%** are High Risk VSC's.
