



🕎 D11NR 2014 Statistics*

The goal for D11NR is **12,500** VSC's. We are **20 %** of our goal for the year and **97%** of 2013 production at this time! The data source is AUXINFO*. Additional stats from AUXINFO* indicates that **1,969** or **77%** have passed the VSC. In addition, **1,049** VSC's or **43%** are First Time VSC's, and **698** or **28%** are High Risk VSC's. In addition,**770** Paddlecraft VSC's have been performed, which is approximately **31%** of our total VSC production. *Statistics as shown in AUXINFO thru **June 1, 2014**

Answers can be found in another location in the report.

- 1-You are checking a brand-new 19' open fisherman with two 90 horsepower outboard motors. The owner has purchased the "Coast Guard Kit" from the dealer. When you check the batteries you see that they are in their own enclosed compartment along with the battery switch. Can you issue the decal?
 - a. Yes, since the owner has the Coast Guard Kit it is obvious that they have serious concern for the safety of the boat and passengers.
 - b. Yes, as long as the batteries are secured and the terminals are covered.
 - c. No, having batteries in an enclosed compartment is dangerous since batteries need to vent excess hydrogen.
 - d. No, a Coast Guard Kit has nothing to do with batteries and therefore is the owner's way of directing the VE away from this dangerous condition.
 - 2. An owner asks you if it is true that a boater <u>must</u> help another boater in danger at sea. Your proper response would be:
 - a. No, while it would certainly be nice to do under the Golden Rule, it certainly is not necessary.
 - b. No, most recreational boaters are not properly trained and equipped to help other boaters on the water. Leave that to the professionals.
 - c. Yes, you must help anyone or anything on the water that is in danger. The "me" generation is passed and new laws are now in place that all boaters must save other boaters in danger regardless of the circumstances.
 - d. Yes, an owner or operator must render assistance to another boater in danger at sea as long as this can be safely done. The Good Samaritan Law even protects the owner or operator.

-A National website has been set up to capture VSC failure information from VSC activity. Please take a minute to go to: http://www.usbi.org/vsc.php and fill in the survey of your 2013 and 2014 VSC failures. This is a very simple process and takes about 15-seconds per 7012/7012a. Please make certain that you pay attention to the date and the state where the VSC was performed.

District News

-At the morning session of the Vessel Examiner (VE) workshop at D/Train in March in Sacramento, there was a question about whether a battery cable hold down with a wing nut was acceptable to pass a VSC and if there was a change in the CFR's. After extensive research, it was determined that this was an informal recommendation from the ABYC, not a change in the CFR's and does not effect the VSC.

-VSC's ON RENTALS-At the request of Commodore Collins, to maintain uniformity in the VSC program, moving forward, ALL VSC's for rental agencies that rent pwc's, fishing boats, houseboats, paddlecraft, etc. will now require a D11NR Rental Agreement with the dealer. This program is relatively simple, straightforward, and is selfexplanatory. You can find a copy of the instructions (ML-1), a sample introduction letter (ML-2), and a copy of the agreement (ML-3) on the D11NR Vessel Examiner (VE) website: <u>http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve/ve.html</u> under "VE FORMS". These are done in Microsoft "Word" and you can tailor them for your individual needs. Please note that to participate in this program, a Program Visitor (PV) is required. However, if you are a Vessel Examiner (VE) and a current Program Visitor (PV), you can fulfill that requirement. Please print (2) copies-one for you to keep after signed by the vendor, and one for the vendor to keep after you and the Program Visitor (PV) have signed it. You should maintain your copies for the calendar year.

-Just a reminder that failure to complete the REQUIRED National Vessel Examiner (VE) workshop by June 30, 2014 (approx 45-days) will result you being placed in REWK status. Any VSC activity after this date will not be able to be entered into AUX DATA until the workshop has been completed. Failure to complete the required workshop by December 31, 2014, will place you in REYR status which means you will have to complete the required workshop and in addition perform 2 VSC's with a qualified examiner and then submit the MT-2 to DIRAUX to be reinstated. Currently, there are 134 D11NR examiners that completed the workshop with approx 125 examiners that have not. Please go to the D11NR website: <u>http://rbsafety.d11nuscgaux.info/ve/ve.html</u> where you can find an easy to follow link to AUXLMS for the 30-minute workshop, or a 1 1/2 hr power-point presentation shown at D/Train that can be downloaded and presented by a qualified instructor locally. If you attempt the AUXLMS version, PLEASE make certain you take the FULL 30-minutes! Please don't wait until the last minute!

-A special request from the Director's office; PLEASE have the qualifying members 7038 with the 5 VSC's entered into AUXDATA by the FSO/SO-IS <u>PRIOR</u> to submission of the MT-2 to the Director's office.
